## Dear Mr. Puga:

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and the US Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) acknowledges receipt of the above referenced document revising improvement plans for the Upper Parker Brothers Arroyo and outlet area along Paisano Boulevard. The October 22, 2015 submittal provides updates to design plans previously submitted July 31, 2014 for the initial Fines Pile grading, Conditional Letter of Map Revision (CLOMER) that included hydrologic and hydraulic analyses for regrading, drainage and cover elements associated with the Upper Parker Brothers Arroyo (PBA). The updates conveyed in the October 22, 2015 plan are consistent with drawings previously submitted for initial fines pile grading activities and incorporate updates to fully coordinate with the Border Highway 375 design. The October 22, 2015 updates include improvements at the outlet area along Paisano Boulevard. This letter provides Project Navigator, Ltd. with authorization and notice to proceed with the revised regrading improvement plans for the Fines Pile, Parker Brothers Arroyo Outlet, Railroad Channel and Triangle areas, and related channel lining installations associated with the July 31, 2014 submittal and October 22, 2015 update. The submittal of a final regrading/channel improvement construction report documenting implementation of the plans to the TCEO/EPA is requested within sixty (60) days of completion of final construction activities for the areas. Please ensure final designs associated with the Fines Pile Cover System and related drainage components are captured in the pending Response Action Plan submittal.

Please be aware that it is the continuing obligation of persons associated with a site to ensure that municipal hazardous waste and industrial solid waste are managed in a manner which does not cause the discharge or imminent threat of discharge of waste into or adjacent to waters in the state, a nuisance, or the endangerment of the public health and welfare as required by 30 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) §335.4. If the activities described in the July 31, 2014 and October 22, 2015 update fail to comply with these requirements, please take any necessary and

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authorized action to correct such conditions. A TCEQ field inspector may conduct an inspection of the site to determine compliance with the submittal.
