Description and Requirements: The Center for Environmental Resource Management (CERM) at UTEP invites applicants for **Student Internships** with the engineering firm, Malcolm Pirnie, in El Paso to work on the ASARCO Remediation Project. Three internships are available, one each in the following general areas:

- Demolition engineering, materials re-use, and asset marketing
- Soil remediation and solid waste management
- Groundwater remediation and management

Applicants must be registered students at UTEP, working towards an undergraduate or graduate degree in an appropriate discipline in the College of Science, College of Engineering, or related program, such as the interdisciplinary Environmental Science and Engineering program. Priority will be given to highly qualified undergraduates, who have completed at least 60 credit hours of classwork. To be considered, applicants should have a minimum GPA of 2.50. Successful applicants will be employees of Malcolm Pirnie for one semester, working for 8-10 hrs/week, and assigned to one of the three teams of scientists and engineers working on-site at the ASARCO Remediation Project. Interns will be required to submit a report describing their experience and will be eligible for academic credit.

Salary: \$12/hr

Application and Selection Procedures: Interested candidates should submit: 1) a letter of application, indicating which position you are interested in, and how the internship fits with your academic and professional goals; 2) a brief resume, identifying past work experience, 3) a copy of UTEP transcript; and 4) names and contact information for three references (UTEP professors and/or former work supervisors).

This information should be submitted electronically in a single pdf file to:

wlhargrove@utep.edu. Applications will be reviewed by a committee of UTEP faculty and the top ranked candidates will be recommended to Malcolm Pirnie for hiring.

Applications should be received by October 8, 2010 for the fall semester, and by January 14, 2011, for spring semester. Start dates are approximately October 22, 2010 for fall semester, and February 1, 2011, for spring semester.
